ABOUT THE CHALLENGE

Week Without Driving invites everyone, especially elected officials and transportation decision-makers, to go without driving for a week, a day, or even one trip. It's a chance to better understand how people who don't drive get around in their daily lives, including youth, older adults, people with disabilities, people who can't afford a car, and people who choose not to drive.

An **estimated 30–40% of Dane County residents don't drive**. Throughout the week, local agencies and advocates are coming together to raise awareness of non-drivers' experiences and transportation needs.
